**Level 5 Applied Social Studies Award
Part-time 2017-2018**



Students wishing to obtain the Applied Social Studies Award may do so by attending part-time classes over two years. Students will be expected to attend college two days per week and find a work placement for a third day. Students study four modules each year and attend IT Classes.

Starting date for this course is Tuesday 26 September 2017.

The modules on offer this year are as follows:

1. Young People and Society – 5N2002

Having studied this module learners should have the knowledge, skill and competence to work safely and effectively as part of a team in youth and community work.

Units of study

- The nature of adolescence and the needs of young people
- Key issues that face young people in a variety of contexts
- Explore how each student's own learning might influence their approach to work with young people

2. Psychology – 5N0754

This module introduces learners to psychological perspectives, psychology as a science and psychological disorders.

Units of Study

- Psychological perspectives and therapeutic interventions
- Understanding of research methods and ethical issues involved in the study of psychology.
- Applying skills/ knowledge to typical work based problems

3. Work Experience – 5N1356

Learners will get an opportunity to prepare relevant work experience material e.g. curriculum vitae and cover letter. They will need to organise a work placement for one day each week. Work Experience skills will include observing good timekeeping, communicating with colleagues and working independently while under direction.

Units of study

- Examine work organisations and personal career opportunities in a particular vocational area
- Explore options for future education, training and employment in light of work experience

4. Intercultural Studies – 5N0765

The aim of this module is to equip the learner with the knowledge, skills and competence to explore, reflect on and analyse intercultural issues.

Units of study

- Culture and Society
- Popular Culture
- Exploring Intercultural Issues – Research and Development
